Special Projects:

The Shandan Bailie School. Founded by Rewi Alley in a remote town in Gansu province. NZCFS sends NZ teachers, equipment and other support to help it serve the local community.

The Gung Ho Co-operative Movement. Also founded by Rewi Alley. NZCFS helps it promote co-operatives throughout China.

The He Ming Qing (Kathleen Hall) Memorial Scholarships. NZCFS funds three to four year tertiary scholarships that support young Chinese from poor rural areas to complete nursing training.

Poverty Alleviation Projects. Working with Women's Federation and other partners to support rural development in several western provinces of China.

Local Branches:

Branches of NZCFS are active in most regions of the country and involved in a range of activities.

Wellington Branch:

- Holds monthly meetings with talks and activities about aspects of Chinese culture, current affairs and trade. These are held at Connolly Hall, Guildford Tce, Thorndon on the third Wednesday at 5.45pm followed by an optional buffet Chinese meal; except in June & July when meetings are held on the third Sunday at 2.30 pm followed by afternoon tea.
- Hosts a major banquet each year, at Chinese New Year.
- Sponsors a weekly Mandarin Corner where those wishing to improve or retain their Chinese language skills mix with native speakers.
- Members also can attend the monthly Chinese feature film (with English sub-titles) presented by the Wellington Branch of the NZ Chinese Language Association.

- Encourages on-going people-to-people contact between citizens of the two countries.
- Assists local citizens' committees to foster their sister-city links with China.
- Co-hosts functions with other Wellington Chinese associations.
