He found a fascinating and often beautiful country, almost completely cut off from the rest of the world and hence full of myths and enigmas. The charming and friendly people, very proud of their country and what they see as its achievements and say they live in a "workers' paradise", but does that reflect reality?

Come back through a virtual time warp and see for yourself: from huge statues to high mountains, talented pre-schoolers to busy libraries, immense hotels to empty roads and singing waitresses to mass dancing.

Don't miss this chance to have a little look inside the "Hermit Kingdom" and see how life in North Korea compares to present-day China.

North Korea is very topical at the moment. When Royden spoke at his branch meeting last month, 78 people crowded in; this is a talk not to be missed!!

# Feather Cloak back in Wellington

### Rewi Alley Friendship and Exchange (RAFE) Fund



This fund was set up last year following the announcement by Mr Liao Hui, of China-Oceania President the Friendship Association at the 2012 national conference in Auckland of the very generous granting of 1 Million RMB (about NZ\$200,000) funding to be provided by the Chinese People's Association for Friendship with Foreign Countries (Youxie) in recognition of the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of our society. The aims of the fund are "to consolidate and deepen friendship between the peoples of China and New Zealand, and push forward bilateral friendly exchanges and cooperation, its

main aims being:

- 1) Projects commemorating the legacy of Rewi Alley;
- 2) Friendly exchange projects agreed by both parties;
- 3) Other projects in terms of cultural and art exchange, educational exchange and youth exchange which aim to promote China-New Zealand friendship".

Huo Yan, 23, has taken up the first Rewi Alley Writing Fellowship, in what is hoped will become a permanent event on the bilateral cultural calendar. She arrived in New Zealand at the end of April and will spend two months here, and is staying at the Michael King Writers Centre in Auckland, named after one of New Zealand's most eminent historians. She plans on completing her novel "The Library," a key work for the Chinese Writers Association, while in New Zealand.
