### NZCFS Conference: Hamilton 2018

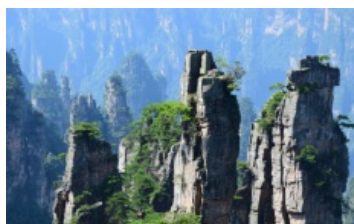


We'd like to welcome everyone to the Annual General Meeting and National Conference to be held at the Waikato University over the 25th, 26th and 27th of May.

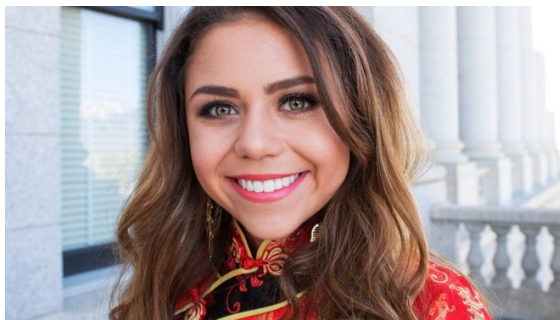

### Chinese Factory Using AI To Breed 6 Billion Cockroaches Each Year



The city of Xichang in China's southwestern Sichuan province is home to a vast multi-story factory that uses artificially intelligent (AI) computers to breed over 6 billion cockroaches a year. It's estimated that the building produces around 28,000 adult cockroaches per 0.09 square meters (1 square foot) each year. Any cockroach born within the facility will never see a ray of sunlight. Computers are used to constantly keep tabs on the indoor environment, gathering data on everything from the food supply and humidity levels to roach growth rates and genetics. For thousands of years, traditional Chinese medicine has touted the benefits of cockroaches for all kinds of ailments, including common colds, stomach bugs, and chronic pain.
