The combined choir has been rehearsing and performing for the last 14 years but has only been called the Barock Choir since their inclusion in the 2011 National Finale.

### Shanghai Trip

Members of the Dunedin Branch of the NZ China Friendship Society and the Dunedin Shanghai Association have been encouraging and supporting Barock's endeavors to participate in the 2015 Choral Arts Week of the Shanghai Spring International Music Festival. In November they received confirmation of their welcome to participate in the festival in May this year. They have already been given financial support from NZCFS - Simon Deng Li and Rewi Alley Friendship and Exchange Funds. As well their performances in the SSIMF, the Barock students will also spend time in their sister schools Number 8 High School (OBHS) and Guangming High School (OGHS).



# Report from Branch President Paul Fawcett

March 2015

After my re-election to Branch
President at our Branch AGM on 12 February, I was happy to receive support from the National Executive to attend my first National Executive Meeting held in the Wellington Council Chambers on 14 February. Overall I found the agenda interesting and the meeting conducted in a friendly and efficient manner. Apart from the usual Committee business and discussion of the Constitution, a number of motions were carried including:

To further explore the setting up of a Hong Kong branch of the NZCFS, an initiative supported by Mr Simon Deng Li;

To subscribe to Sister Cities New Zealand Membership in order to be eligible to attend their National Conference; To pursue an agreement with the Winston Churchill Fellowship in order to allow NZCFS members to apply for funding to undertake projects in China;

To ratify the Tours Committee's decision to appoint a Deputy Leader of tours and to pay half their airfare for tour groups greater than 15;

For President Dave Bromwich to present a gift to Ms Wang Fang, the NZCFS Tour Guide based in China, on the occasion of her wedding on 1 March.

It was also reported that: Alistair Shaw continues to work on the NZCFS history and requests photos of branch related activities; that two members of Youxie will attend the Nelson AGM on 23 May and then tour the region and branches; and that the Shandan Bailie School is looking for a new teacher to begin in August 2015.

On another subject, I'm sure that like me you are relieved to hear that despite many hurdles and setbacks the visit by the Barock Choir of OB and OG High Schools to participate in the Shanghai International Spring Music Festival in May is to proceed. Congratulations and thanks to Mr Rob Duffy and Ms Annie Zong for all their hard work. It is also great news that the choir has received financial support from China to attend a choral event in Nanjing after the Shanghai Festival but regrettable that this means the choir will not return to New Zealand in time for members to attend the forthcoming NZCFS National Conference in Nelson. It will therefore be up to me to give a talk at the Conference on how the long and tortuous path to Barock's success illustrates the Conference theme of Yo Banfa.

I look forward to seeing you all at forthcoming events .


