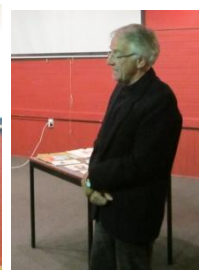

We are pleased that Mandarin Language Assistants from the Confucius Institute are busy working in our local schools, and supporting our branch and the Mandarin Language Course.

What do you enjoy most about the teaching?

I feel confident and satisfying during the teaching, and every



achievement made by the students will make me more passionate for teaching.

What do you think of the students' attitudes to learning?

Most Columba girls are quite self-motivated in learning Chinese. They are ready to learn and willing to learn Chinese not only the language itself but also some cultural knowledge.



What has been an example of an interesting response?

Every time we did some class activities, the girls were always keen to know who was the winner. For me, it's interesting because I can see how NZ people love sports and are eager to win.

What challenges do the students face with language learning?

It's quite struggling for them to distinguish the differences among the four tones. And when it comes to the strokes of the characters, they tend to miss some small strokes or mix the similar ones.

How are you dealing with those challenges?

I've created the climbing hill way and musical way to help the associate with four tones in Mandarin, which seems to be helpful. And I will encourage them to make their own Chinese character stories by seeing character writing as painting and share the stories together.

AUGUST MEETING



Contemporary China – Visual Culture and New Technologies

A presentation by Dr Paola Voci, an expert on Chinese Film.

Wednesday 12 August 7.00pm

Dr Voci is Associate Professor in the University of Otago Department of Languages and Cultures. She teaches Chinese language and culture, as well as papers on Chinese cinema and Asian Popular cultures. Dr Voci's research focuses on visual culture and in particular, film and videomaking practices in contemporary China.

The presentation will cover Chinese cinema with a particular focus on the role of Chinese documentary practices in contemporary China.



China On Video is the first in-depth study that examines smaller-screen realities and the important role they play not only in the fast-changing Chinese mediascape, but also more broadly in the practice of experimental and non-mainstream cinema.
