

Bill Willmott was born in 1932 at Chengdu, Sichuan, where his parents were United Church of Canada educational missionaries. He was educated to High-school level in China before going to Oberlin College in Ohio. He completed a BA in Sociology and then an MA in Anthropology at McGill University, Montreal, based on research on the Inuit community at Inukjak, Northern Quebec. His PhD in Social Anthropolgy was completed at the London School of Economics in 1964 based on research among the Chinese in Cambodia.

He taught at the University of British Columbia before moving to the University of Canterbury, Christchurch, in 1973, where, on retirement from the Chair of Scociology in 1998, he is Emeritus Professor. Until this year he was a Research Associate at the Macmillan Brown Centre for Pacific Studies, U. of Canterbury,

His academic research has focussed on Chinese overseas communities, most recently in the Pacific islands and rural communities in New Zealand.

Throughout he has kept a close eye on what has been happening in China.

He was President of the New Zealand China Friendship Society for 10 years (1989-94 and 1997-2002) and has conducted a number of study tours to China for NZCFS and also the Continuing Education Department of the University of Canterbury.

He was made a Companion of the New Zealand Order of Merit in 2001 and was granted the Chinese honour of 'Friendship Ambassador in 2002.

We are sure to have a most interesting talk on June 25th.
