Recent experiences on the Silk Road through Muslim China"

Bill has aleady (June 25th) regaled us with a fascinating review of problems facing modern China. **Please bring as many friends and contacts as possible.**

The following is based on a communication from Prof. Bill Willmott that he sent to Marie Greetham:

They've (we've) started the count-down to the

opening of the Beijing Olympics, which will take place at 8 seconds 8 minutes past 8pm on 8 August 2008, which can be summarised as 08/08/08/08/08/08. Can't get more auspicious than that! The Chinese for 8 is ba (first tone), which brings to a Chinese mind the eight treasures of Buddhism, cooking, etc., as well as the word fa (first tone) with which it is a homophone in some Chinese languages and probably was in classical (Han Dynasty) Chinese. Fa has all sorts of good meanings, like generating (profits, electricity), emitting (sun's rays, good qi, etc.), developing, flourishing. So the opening will be a bā bā bā bā bā bā bā. How good can it get?! Let us hope they manage to clear up the pollution by then!

Note: 'ba': sounds like the Chinese word 'fa': (both first tone), which means 'develop, expand, grow, flourish'.

In the common New Years' greeting <Gongxi Facai>, facai means 'expand wealth' i.e., get rich, so there's a connotation in 'ba' regarding wealth as well.

Gong(first) Xi(third) Fa(first) Cai(second). Gongxi translate as "congratulations", Facai as "get rich"
