

## March meeting The history, culture, and capabilities of the Chinese People's Liberation Army (PLA) Air Commodore (Rtd) Peter Guy MNZM Friday, March 25, 5:30 p.m.

Air Commodore (Rtd) Peter Guy MNZM, will give a presentation on the history, culture and capabilities of the Chinese People's Liberation Army (PLA). As a former Defence Attaché in Beijing, Peter has had a unique opportunity to work with, study and meet many of China's top military officers. Forty years ago, China had a vast, but outdated and ineffective, Armed Forces. It now possesses global world class military capabilities and can project power far outside of its own region. Arguably the next superpower, China's armed forces are the only military in the world that can seriously challenge the capabilities of the United States. In his presentation, Peter will look at this rising military juggernaut, its complex history, culture, and capability.

#### New Zealand week in Hubei

We have received a message from Queena who is a young lady in the Huangshi Foreign Affairs Office:

As you know, the year 2022 marks the 50th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic ties between New Zealand and China, also the 125th birthday of our New Zealand friend Rewi Alley who made great contributions to Hubei people.

In order to enhance friendships between people of New Zealand and Hubei, there will be a Hubei-New Zealand Week which includes a series of activities in Hubei to memorize the 125th birthday of Rewi Alley.

It goes on to ask for co-operation with 3 tasks for the Hubei provincial government.

- 1 Arranging for 10 paintings on the theme "The same white cloud, the same blue sky." from Nelson schoolchildren, having them scanned and e-mailed. Those paintings will be exhibited in related city libraries and primary and secondary schools in Wuhan and some other cities of Hubei province in late May during the New Zealand Week period. After that, those paintings will be permanently collected by the Hubei Provincial Library.
- 2 Inviting the mayor of Nelson to attend a joint video conference, roughly in May, of Hubei-New Zealand sister cities and deliver a speech, discussing how to deepen friendly exchanges and cooperation between the two sides.
- 3 Recommending a primary school or 'middle' school in Nelson to exchange with a Huangshi school and sign a Letter of Intent for Friendly Communication on the joint video conference.

Waimea Intermediate will provide some paintings, and Rachel Reese has been invited to participate in the video conference.

The message continues

During the New Zealand Week period, rewalking the road that Rewi Alley had walked will take place in the Bund Park in Wuhan, which Clare Fearnley, New Zealand Ambassador to China, relatives of Rewi Alley, representatives of New Zealand students in Hubei, representatives of New Zealand enterprises in Hubei, and officials of Hubei, will all attend this activity by walking 1250 steps to memorize the 125th birthday of Rewi Alley.

What's more, a joint seminar themed by "Opportunities and challenges of economic and trade cooperation between central China and New Zealand under RCEP framework" will be held in Wuhan in late May, which concerned specialists, scholars, entrepreneurs and friendly personages will attend and give speeches.

Christchurch will also have received similar requests as it is a sister city to Wuhan.

It seems that owing to a number of factors, events for this are actually going to be spread over a period of about 3 months. One of the events is to be an Appo Hocton related, a tour of houses he was associated with. This was originally scheduled for April 21 but may now be changed.
