Guest Speaker: Michael Powles

What would we expect of Rewi Alley today?

The Wellington Branch AGM for 2023 will be held on 15 March 2023. We're pleased to announce that our Guest Speaker at the AGM is Michael Powles, former President of the Wellington Branch of the NZ China Friendship Society and life member of NZCFS Wellington Branch.

Michael was Ambassador in Beijing from 1990 to 1993 and **New Zealand's** Ambassador to Indonesia and to the United Nations in New York. He was also High Commissioner to Fiji and other Pacific Island countries.

After retiring from the foreign service, Michael was appointed the Human Rights Commissioner and Founding Chairman of the Pacific Cooperation Foundation. He lived in Shanghai from 2006 to 2008 and was associated with Fudan University there, and is now a Senior Fellow with the Centre for Pacific Studies at Victoria University of Wellington. He has lectured



and written on issues relating to New Zealand's relations with China and China's involvement in the South Pacific.

Michael will talk to us after the AGM, followed by a buffet dinner at \$15 per head. More information will be sent out closer to the date.

WELLINGTON BRANCH — CHINESE NEW YEAR BANOUET 2023

On 28 January 2023, the New Zealand China Friendship Society Wellington Branch hosted its annual Chinese New Year Banquet at Aries Restaurant in Wellington to celebrate the Chinese New Year of the Rabbit.

More than 160 people, including branch members, their families, and friends attended the banquet. Dr Wang Xiaolong, Chinese Ambassador to New Zealand; Nicola Willis, Deputy Leader of the National Party; Tory Whanau, Wellington Mayor; John McKinnon, former NZ Ambassador and President of the New Zealand China Council; Hiromi Morris, Emeritus President of Global Cities New Zealand, and Ray Chung, Wellington Chinese City Councillor were in attendance.



National President and Wellington Branch President, Chris Lipscombe delivered a welcome speech and wished everyone a happy Chinese New Year and prosperous year of the Rabbit. Ambassador Wang Xiaolong talked about the continuing strong relationship between New Zealand and China and thanked New Zealand Friendship Society for its many years' contribution to the relationship. MP Nicola Willis and Mayor Tory Whanau both noted that Chinese New Year is an important festival in Wellington and acknowledged the contribution Chinese people have made to our multicultural society.



Two rounds of raffle draws were held during the banquet. Ambassador Wang Xiaolong and other special guests together with the leaders of the Chinese community groups were invited to draw raffle prizes. Many lucky winners took away a range of prizes with Chinese elements.

The banquet included two lots of Chinese music performances played by three Chinese music instrumentalists (Guzheng, Erhu and Flute). **The players' skilful performances** were impressive and well received, and helped to add joy to the banquet.


Participants were entertained by a variety of cultural performances presented by local Chinese communities.
