## China news sources.

Apart from the usual western sources of news, there are a few other on-line sites with some interest in news related to China. Currently, all are carrying stories related to the U.S. downing of what the Chinese government is calling a “civilian airship”. There are also many stories about COVID-19 in China since the removal of the ‘lock-down’ restrictions.

Reliably providing the Chinese Government view is **China Daily**. At the time of writing it had stories on how the government is cracking down on out-of-school tutoring, the provision of special transport facilities to get migrant workers back to their factories after the Spring Festival break, and how outstanding third-grade senior high school students who are learning Russian language in ordinary senior high schools in Henan province will be selected to study in Russia and continue their undergraduate studies in Russia for 60 to 72 months. <http://www.chinadaily.com.cn/>

Another site which is Government friendly is **Global Times**. This has comments on the Russia – Ukraine conflict, and notes that the first cross-sea high-speed railway has passed static acceptance testing which indicates the line will be operational within a year. <https://www.globaltimes.cn/>

A slightly different viewpoint is the Hong Kong based **South China Morning Post**, independent but presumably subject to pressure from the territory’s government. It currently has stories on a new airliner, tensions in the South China Sea, and many of the stories in the ‘Spotlight’ section relate to COVID-19. <https://www.scmp.com/>

**The China Project** is not based in China and “receives no financial support or influence from any individual or organization affiliated with any government”. Its Mission Statement includes “The China Project exists to provide audiences around the world with an accurate, comprehensive, and contextual understanding of China”. This site is more analysis than headlines, and has some interesting insights including Chinese stations in Antarctica and Canada’s intent to allow a number of Uyghur refugees to settle there. <https://thechinaproject.com/>
