Flowers in Chinese culture



China is the home to one of the world's longest-standing traditions of garden-making. In this context, the Chinese engagement with plants has been a profoundly intellectual and emotional one; plants, and flowers in particular, served a variety of aesthetic, practical, and metaphoric purposes and a powerful but restricted and highly moralised plant-based symbolic language developed which the gardens of China (private, imperial, and monastic) sought to embody. This illustrated talk by Duncan Campbell will discuss aspects of this tradition.



A Wellingtonian who went to school in the Wairarapa, Duncan Campbell graduated in English and History from Te Herenga Waka Victoria University of Wellington and then spent some years in Malaysia studying Mandarin. From 1976 to 1978 he was a student in the People's Republic of China. Since then, he has taught Chinese language, literature, modern and classical, and aspects of Chinese history and civilisation at the University of Auckland, Victoria University of Wellington, and the Australian National University in Canberra.

From 2015 to 2016 Duncan was Director of the Center for East Asian Garden Studies and Curator of the Chinese Garden with the Huntington Library, Art Collections, and Botanical Gardens in San Marino, USA. His research focuses on the literary and material culture of late imperial China, with specific areas of interest that include gardens and their literary and pictorial representation, letter writing and diaries, travel and travel writing, aspects of print culture, the history of the late imperial private library, biographical and autobiographical writing, and literary translation.

Duncan's book *The Dumbarton Oaks Anthology of Chinese Garden Literature* (coedited with Alison Hardie) was published in 2020. *Encountering China: New Zealanders and the People's Republic of China* was co-edited with Brian Moloughney and published by Massey University Press in December 2022.

Duncan will talk to members and friends at our monthly meeting on the importance and meaning of flowers in Chinese culture, and his experience of the Chinese culture and language.

BUT WAIT, THERE'S MORE...

The Wellington Branch of the New Zealand China Friendship Society has collaborated with Wairarapa Word to bring you <u>two</u> special Matariki-based events later in the week— one in Carterton, and the other in Masterton — both featuring Duncan Campbell.

The first event, on Friday 21 July at Carterton Library, will be an illustrated talk by Duncan on the history of the book in China, with a focus on the story of a particular library close to the little southern Chinese town of Changshu during the closing years of the Ming dynasty (1368-1644).

The following day, on Saturday 22 July at Aratoi in Masterton, in the spirit of Matariki and remembrance, we will be acknowledging the 30+ year relationship between Masterton and Changchun and Wellington Branch President Chris Lipscombe will be interviewing Duncan on the putting together of *Encountering China*, published to celebrate 50 years of diplomatic relations between New Zealand and the People's Republic of China.


