Luo Hui has written on Chinese cinema, poetry, ghost tales, crime fiction, and issues of soft power — academic writing as well as creative non-fiction. He has lived in China, US, Canada, and now lives in Wellington where he is a senior lecturer in Chinese at the School of Languages & Cultures at Te Herenga Waka Victoria University. He is also a co-director of the New Zealand Centre for Literary Translation.

Madeleine Slavick has authored various books of non-fiction, poetry, and photography, several of which relate to China and Hong Kong. She has lived in the US and Hong Kong, and now lives in Wairarapa, where she runs adult programmes at a public library, works in a bookstore, and directs the arts residency programme NZ Pacific Studio as well as the writer series *Wairarapa Word*.
