China's Minister of Education, Mr Huai Jinpeng, attended the New Zealand International Education conference in Christchurch in August, where he was a keynote speaker. During his visit to the city, he took the opportunity to have lunch with Mayor Phil Mauger, as well as visiting both the University of Canterbury and Lincoln University.

The Selwyn Sister City Committee was asked to arrange a visit for him to Springfield on Saturday 19 August, to visit Rewi Alley's birthplace. Committee chair Allison Rosanowski welcomed Mr Huai, and explained to him the background to the sculpture in the Rewi Alley park, which was created by Lu Bo, the husband of Rewi Alley's foster son Deng Bang Zhen.

Unveiling of Rewi Alley Statue



In the first visit to China of a New Zealand minister in four years, New Zealand Foreign Minister Nanaia Mahuta unveiled a bronze statue in March of Rewi Alley in the Beijing compound of the Chinese People's Association for Friendship with Foreign Countries (CPAFFC), where Rewi Alley lived for the last 30 years of his life. More than 40 participants attended the ceremony, including

Ambassador of New Zealand to China Graham Morton, Foreign Minister Mahuta and her delegation and Mr Lin Songtian, president of CPAFFC as well as senior Chinese officials and

people from mainstream media and staff of the CPAFFC. Mr Lin said "In order to pay high tribute to his outstanding contributions to China's revolution, construction, reform and opening up and the sincere friendship he helped forge with the Chinese people, carry forward his spirit, and encourage more people of vision to participate in the friendship cause between China and other countries, we have not only renovated his former residence, set up a photo exhibition of his life, but also sculpted a bronze statue of him. It is a great honor for me to join Foreign Minister Mahuta to unveil the statue of Rewi Alley today. The CPAFFC is willing to work with friends from all sectors in New Zealand to make new contributions to promoting our bilateral relations to a new high, so as to bring more benefits to the peoples of our two countries". Minister Mahuta thanked the CPAFFC for inviting her to take part in such a symbolic event. "In coming here and visiting the place where Rewi stayed, it's a demonstration of how friendship can lead to diplomatic relations," Mahuta said.
